


The Animal I Selected Is....




Yellow-spotted Millipede—This critter has 62 legs. (Wow! That's a lot of legs!) Millipedes like to eat fallen leaves, which they convert into rich topsoil. The topsoil is necessary for forest plants to grow.


Red Tree Vole—Related to rats, these voles live only in northern California and Oregon. They like to eat conifer needles. Owls, on the other hand, like to eat voles.





