Issue 2: Wolf hunting!

Even if wolves are off the list, it doesn't necessarily mean there would be a legal hunting season. As a team, consider the pros and cons of allowing citizens to hunt wolves legally.

- o Should there be a wolf hunting season?
- o If so, should there be a limit as to how many wolves can be killed per season (a quota)?
- o How big or small should the quota be?
- o Should the hunting season be limited to a short amount of time (in weeks) or a long amount of time (months) or should it be open season all year long?

Regardless of your decision, you must explain why you chose open or close wolf hunting season.

Regardless of the official protection status of wolves, they will continue to interact with ranchers and their livestock. In some states, ranchers are allowed to kill any wolf they see harming their wildlife, as long as they report the kill. Some states pay ranchers compensation for livestock lost to wolves. As a team, consider the pros and cons of rancher interactions.
