- Evidence collected during the interviews—(a) handwritten letter from Ryan Dixon to Ed Lee, and (b) the four hunting licenses from Cory Lucero and Ryan Dixon
- Your Investigator Notebook

Your Steps

1. Now that the interviewing is complete, you should be back in your investigative teams (no longer in interview groups). Add the new evidence of the four hunting licenses and the letter to your "Evidence List" along with evidence collected at the crime scene and Dixon/Lucero cabin.
2. Take turns having each team member report on the information gathered from the interviews. Each member will report on two of the eight interviews.
3. Record information about each interview on your "Witness List," and add information to the timeline as needed.
4. If you have additional questions for any of the eight people interviewed, write them down. Your teacher can ask those cast members to visit your classroom over the next few days so you can talk with them.
5. Ask your teacher for the "Additional Interviews" handout. Add any new information to your "Witness List."
6. Brainstorm and record ideas in your Investigator Notebook about what your team thinks might have happened based on the interviews and evidence. You will need to write the Final Case Report after you analyze the evidence on Days 4 and 5.

Roger Moore, Owner of Town Market

"Ryan Dixon came to the store several times between October 10 and 17. Besides small amounts of grocery items, he bought dozens of day-old

donuts and several crates of over-ripe cantaloupe and apples that had been taken off display."

Interviewed on October 26 in Denver, Colorado.

There is no record of Mr. Ryan Dixon purchasing or using a ticket from Denver to St. Louis between October 16 and October 21.

"My wife Eliza went to help out a sick friend for a few days. She left on October 20 and got in the evening of the 21st. I do not know the person she was with. She said it was someone from work."

"Ryan was not at work from October 10 through October 21. He was hunting from the October 10 through October 14. He called in sick the next week. He said the week of hunting really wore him down. He was home in bed with a fever and a severe cold.
