Making the Arrest

1. Ask the suspect to confirm his/her name. "Are you \_\_\_\_\_?"
2. Read the offense(s) you are charging him/her with. "You are under arrest for \_\_\_\_\_."
3. Handcuff the suspect.
4. Read the Advisement of Rights:
  - You have the right to remain silent.
  - Anything you say can be used against you in court.
  - You have the right to talk to an attorney before you are questioned and to have your attorney present with you during any questioning.
  - If you want an attorney, but cannot afford to hire one, an attorney will be appointed by a court to represent you before you are questioned and to be with you during any questioning.
  - If you decide to start answering questions, you will still have the right to stop answering questions and the right to talk to an attorney at any time.
  - Do you understand your rights?
5. Lead him or her to the principal's office or other predetermined location.
6. Remove handcuffs and turn him or her over to the higher authority.
