5. An all-day drive that takes one into Yellowstone via the Beartooth Highway into Cook City through the Park and out through West Yellowstone is a trip that will exhaust but delight the visitor. In "Zen and "the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance", the Beartooth highway is called the most beautiful highway in the world. Plus, the return trip to Bozeman, takes one through the Gallatin Canyon—a treasure chest of geology. One spot (about 8 miles south of 4 corners) has the one of the oldest outcropping of rocks in the world. There's a book The Roadside Geology of Montana by Alt & Hyndman, and The Roadside Geology of the Yellowstone Country by Fritz.
