Graduate-Level Credit Requirements

Credit Options Available:

Registration Instructions:

Register within 2 weeks of the virtual event ending date.

Requirements:

Assignments for 1 Graduate-Level Credit:

- A. Attend a minimum of 6 of the virtual event sessions. (Can include vendor visiting time)
- B. Write a brief summary of each session/workshop attended. Summarize the session in 150-250 words. Cover the following topics:
 - What can I apply to my teaching?
 - What were the "AHA" moments?
 - What were the strengths?
 - What would have made this session/workshop more valuable to me?
- C. Attach a copy of your NSTA STEM20: Virtual Event Attendance certificate.

Assignments for 2 Graduate-Level Credits: (In addition to requirements above)

Participants earning 2 graduate-level credits must attend a minimum of 2 days of the event. The participant will complete the 1 credit assignments above plus these additional requirements:

- A. Attendance at 6 additional hours of the virtual event sessions. These sessions will include viewing the "after" sessions. (Write-up each session as above)
- B. Attend at least two 40-minute sessions devoted to "Vendor Visiting". Write one page describing the potential implication for your classroom.
- C. Create a lesson plan to illustrate the implementation of one of the concepts from the sessions.
- D. Share your virtual event experience! Write up or design a presentation that you can use to share your virtual event ideas with your classroom students, faculty, department, PTA, or at a Staff training.

Accreditation & Types of Credits/Units

The Continuing Education and Professional Development division of The School of Liberal Arts and Education is responsible for all the course listed on this syllabus. The credit offered is **Graduate-Level**, meaning that it is post-baccalaureate. It is primarily used for professional development or salary advancement and is transferable to degree programs only on the approval of the institution being petitioned.
