To evaluate a session, you should visit the conference session browser (www.nsta.org/chicagobrowser) and search for part of the session title or presenter's name using the **Find Keyword** search option. Once you find the session you wish to evaluate, simply click the **Evaluate Session** button, enter your badge number, and answer the evaluation questions. When you finish evaluating the session, click the **Submit Evaluation** button. Repeat this process for each session attended.

Note: Our session evaluation system is designed to work from a computer and while it may work on smartphones/tablets, it is not really designed for them.

When you fill out a session evaluation, you get entered into a drawing for a chance to win a Kindle Fire HDX 7" courtesy of the NSTA Conference Department. Remember, the more sessions you attend and evaluate, the more chances you have to win!

Concurrent session presenters may also complete an evaluation for their own sessions in order to track professional development credit. Remember—the last day to evaluate Chicago sessions is **March 26**.

Beginning **April 7, 2015**, you can view your transcript at the NSTA Learning Center (learningcenter.nsta.org) by clicking on "My PD Record and Certificates." You can also document credit for activities that are not being evaluated (e.g., Exhibit Hall visits). In addition, the NSTA Learning Center offers professional development experiences (online and face-to-face) for your long-term growth and professionalism.

Four floors of exhibits housed in a historic lakefront mansion portray the ancient and modern healing practices of Eastern and Western civilizations—from acupuncture to X-rays—through artifacts, fine art, and archival materials.

The museum is easily accessible by bus or train—take the Red line to Clark/Division, the Brown line to Sedgwick, or the CTA #151 bus to North Avenue.

Discounted parking is available with ticket validation at three locations: 1350 North Lake Shore, 1445 North State, and the Chicago History Museum lot on the corner of Stockton and LaSalle.
