The *Global Conversations* session encourages submissions from diverse areas of science education including elementary through to college science education, policy standards, best practices, novel content delivery, scientific literacy, and informal education.

This year's Share-a-thon has changed from previous years. To encourage and include as many educators as possible from around the world, we will be accepting: **In-person share-a-thon presentations** and

Short, self-running video presentations.

A. 5–7-minute video presentations. These will run concurrently with the in–person sh

These will run concurrently with the in–person share-a-thon. All accepted videos will be compiled into a self-running show.

Notes on Video Submissions: Registration in the conference is NOT required! There is no cost to submit a video.

• **LENGTH**: Videos should be between 5-7 minutes. Shorter videos are permitted but videos are not to exceed 7 minutes.

- **VIDEO FILE FORMATS:** Videos must be MP4. Other formats might not be supported.
- STYLE: While not mandatory, the prefered presentation style for videos is to follow a Pecha Kucha 20x20 format (see <u>https://www.pechakucha.com/</u>)

Videos that are submitted can be slideshows with or without narration, recordings of presentations, poster highlights with voice-overs, interviews, and more.

- **PRESENTATION**: You do not have to be present for the film presentations. Contact information should be included somewhere in the video for the audience to take note.
- **LANGUAGE**: English will be the primary language of communication. Please subtitle videos that use other languages.
- **PRIVACY**: (of underage students) You will either provide a statement that all underage participants have parental consent for their image or name to be shown publicly or electronic blurring is used to mask the identities of minors.

B. In-person Share-a-Thon Presentation

Presenters will be asked to stand by their table to present and answer questions. Posters are encouraged. Any handouts can be uploaded to the conference program. Giveaways at your station are up to you.

<u>Notes on in-person Presentations:</u> Registration in the conference is required.

Trifold boards will be provided upon request. Access to electricity will be provided. Please bring your own power bar.
