Requirements:

- A. **Me and the Conference (100 pts):** Make a copy of your certificate attendance or a pic of your badge.
- B. **My Sessions (100 pts):** Attend a minimum of 8 hours of conference sessions. This usually means 8 one-hour sessions or equivalent hours of longer workshops. Then write a brief summary of each session/workshop attended. Summarize the session in 150-250 words. Cover the following topics:
 - a. What can I apply to my teaching?
 - b. What were the strengths?
 - c. What would have made this session/workshop more valuable to me?
 - d. Include the email address of at least one of the presenters.
- C. **Keynote** (100 pts): Attend at least 1 keynote session. Write an 800-1500 word reflection on the implications of the presentation for education focusing on your school community in particular.
- D. Vendor Mini-Classes (100 pts): Attend at least 2 vendor mini classes on the exhibit floor. Write a 500-750 word reflection regarding the potential implications for your classroom.
- E. **Share Your experience! (100 pts):** Prepare a Powerpoint presentation listing the 'Top Ten' new or interesting ideas you learned from the conference. This could be shared with

- Other
